FIDDLER'S GREEN RECLAIMS NAME

The Coors Amphitheatre in Greenwood Village will once again be known as Fiddler's Green, after Coors Brewing ended a sponsorship deal with concert promoter Live Nation.

The deal's termination is part of a shift by Coors away from entertainment sponsorships.

The Museum of Outdoor Arts, an Englewood-based nonprofit that owns the property where Fiddler's Green sits, initially gave the amphitheater its name. The concert venue opened in 1988.

According to the new Oxford American Dictionary, Fiddler's Green refers to a kind of sailor's heaven that's "traditionally a place of wine, women and song."

The amphitheater is 15 miles southeast of downtown Denver and offers reserved seating for 6,823 and additional seating for 10,000 on a landscaped lawn. It boasts spectacular Rocky Mountain sunsets.
